As we continue to open doors and open minds as Calgary's only comprehensive community College, Bow Valley College remains steadfast in our vision of shaping the future of postsecondary education by supporting Alberta's diversification and growth. We equip our students with the skills and knowledge they need to be confident, resilient and employment-ready in their fields including in emerging sectors such as technology, innovation and creative industries.

The needs of our students and the workforce in our province continue to evolve and we are prepared to meet these demands by adapting quickly to industry needs while offering unparalleled support in our students' quests to succeed. This includes flexible learning opportunities, industry-trained instructors, applied learning, work integrated learning opportunities and extensive student support services.

One of our top priorities remains including all learners and expanding access to a high-quality and affordable education by recognizing the diversity in the social, economic, cultural and educational backgrounds and experiences of our student body. At the centre of this work is our commitment to Indigenization and to EDI (equity, diversity and inclusion), with students from 135 countries around the world. We welcome nearly 600 Indigenous students each year and continue our efforts to recognize that truth and reconciliation is a shared responsibility in our community. Of the 15,077 learners taking classes in the 2022/23 academic year, more than 3,000 are international students with 112 languages spoken amongst our College population. The average student age of our students is 31 years old and 70% are women. Your contributions to our students' lives offer stability and hope as they work to overcome challenges so that they can become graduates who became changemakers in their communities.

This report will highlight the impact of your generosity, while also sharing some of the exciting new developments we've undertaken at Bow Valley College, as we continue to explore the ways we can make real, tangible differences in the lives of our students and in our community. The work we do ensures a world-class education remains accessible and affordable, especially in our current reality of the rising cost of living.

In November 2022, we held our annual Giving Day with a goal of raising \$50,000 to address food insecurity on campus. Our goal was nearly doubled with \$98,000 raised in a single day and served as a reminder that our ability to meet our students' needs is truly a collaborative community effort. We want to recognize and acknowledge that we couldn't do this work without you. Your support ensures that we are able to inspire a brighter future for learners of all backgrounds, as well as the communities they will transform as a result of your generosity.

This report is just a small snapshot of what Bow Valley College has achieved over the past year with your continued support. The stories you'll read reflect the best of how donor support and funding make a crucial contribution to the lives and wellbeing of our students. You'll also have the opportunity to learn about some of the dynamic initiatives we've been working on, including our digital strategy, and how these have contributed to the opportunities our learners have to expand their education and how you can be involved in these exciting initiatives.

We are thrilled to celebrate these successes with you, and we recognize the heart of these accomplishments is our common desire to see students flourish. We know your gift will create a ripple effect of positive impact on the future of our province. #### **Year in Review**

In our ongoing efforts to respond to the needs of our students and our province, we want to also recognize the building blocks that have been laid over the past year as we continue to build a legacy of educational excellence and student success. We are inspired by the spirit and leadership of our students, our staff and our city.

In 2022/23, we moved forward with our Open Doors – Open Minds campaign, created to

champion the way forward for our students by investing in the financial support, technology and digital access, and dynamic economic ignition programs that will see them play a key role in igniting Alberta's economy.

Here are just a few highlights of another eventful and momentous year at Bow Valley College.

- In June 2023, the College announced a collaboration with Microsoft Canada that will advance our digital transformation journey and pioneer new possibilities in technological innovation. This announcement coincided with the introduction of our new digital strategy, approved by the Board of Governors in December 2022, designed to drive a more accessible and inclusive learning while supporting student success leveraging Microsoft technology, tools and expertise. The initiative is guided five pillars: Enhance the Learner Experience; Enhance the Applicant Experience; Academic Innovation; Enabling Employee Success and Supporting Strategic Success.
- After the opening of the Bow Valley College Centre for Entertainment Arts (CEA) in March 2022, we are set to launch The Calgary Entertainment Arts Production Hub in January 2024. The Hub will serve as a home for students, industry, researchers, entrepreneurs and collaborators to provide the city with world-class talent and businesses in creative industries. It will also feature Centre for Entertainment Arts academic programs, a creative industries business incubator and applied research activities.
- In July, City Council approved the College's proposal to rename the City Hall CTrain platforms to City Hall-Bow Valley College, recognizing the significance of our downtown campus, which has been based at its current location since 1972. A celebration of the renaming was held in September 2023, featuring remarks from Mayor Jyoti Gondek, Councillor Terry Wong and College President and CEO, Dr Misheck Mwaba.
- On October 27, 2023, the College hosted the 26<sup>th</sup> annual Premier's Scholarship Luncheon. Thanks to the generosity of our partners, including our matching funds sponsor Pathways Alliance, we raised over \$174,000 towards scholarships that help students pursue their education and become work-ready graduates. We were pleased to welcome The Honourable Danielle Smith, several Calgary and area caucus members, as well as the generous donors and attendees who ensured we can continue to empower students to become changemakers in their own lives and in Alberta.

#### By the Numbers

We are always exploring new and improved ways to equip our students with the tools they need to succeed in established and emerging fields while keeping Alberta's diversification and growth in mind. Our 15,000 students have access to opportunities that challenge their thinking and broaden their perspectives, with over 900 courses offered to transform them into confident, employment-ready graduates.

Financial access has always been a key component to the success of our students, and we know financial support makes the difference between their ability to pursue educational opportunities or not. The largest allocation of funds raised through the Open Doors -Open Minds campaign will be the \$27

million Success through Access Endowment Fund. At a 4% disbursement rate, this will provide \$1.08 million for our students in the form of bursaries and scholarships, and will increase our support to students by 400%. The fund will see an annual return of 5-7%, and with the disbursement rate, will grow and give back in perpetuity, opening the door to post-secondary education for thousands of Albertans.



#### **Report to SABVC**

The role your generosity plays in the lives of our students often makes the difference in their ability to begin or continue their educational journey. Your gift supports students who are seeking to make a difference by actively participating in activities that support their communities, allowing them to navigate circumstances that may otherwise act as barriers to pursuing their goals.



Thank you for partnering with the College to create opportunities that will continue to open doors and minds for generations to come.

Thanks to our donors, in 2022/23, we awarded nearly 850 students with more than \$1.6 million in student awards and bursaries, providing them a means of moving forward with their ambitions despite financial burdens that may otherwise act as obstacle to their success. Mitigating this burden is life-changing for many and you make it possible.

In the 2022-23 academic year, we were able to officially announce the commitment of \$1 million from SABVC to our Open Doors – Open Minds campaign. This gift will continue to support the Academic Success Centre, student awards already established by SABVC, and the creation of an endowment that will support access to education for decades to come.

The commitment of SABVC to the success of Bow Valley College is unique amongst postsecondary institutions, as it is one of only three student unions in the country to have pledged more than \$1 million gifts to their respective institutions.

Since 2018, SABVC has funded more than \$245,000 in awards and bursaries benefiting 239 unique students. This includes more than \$98,000 in awards supporting 75 students and almost \$147,000 in Financial Needs Bursaries supporting 176 students. These awards and bursaries were made possible thanks to SABVC's \$1.25 million donation to our Quest for Best campaign in 2017.

Throughout the 2022-23 year, these were some of the key undertakings of the EDI Strategist, partially funded through SABVC's generous contributions:

- Advised and processed decisions related to student requests for accommodations under all protected grounds (other than disability)
- Delivered the EDI series workshops on topics including anti-racism, whiteness, and intersectionality
- Created Discovery Hub installations on Land Acknowledgement and Pride Flags
- Co-chaired the Pride Committee which ran BVC Pride Week and led the Calgary Pride Parade planning
- Hosted a booth at the Pride Festival
- Developed an EDI Guide for faculty when preparing materials for their courses
- Worked with the Work Integrated Learning Team on a process for providing accommodations for students in placements.

Your annual commitment also supports peer tutoring programs, run through the Academic Success Centre, that are an invaluable tool providing a safe learning environment and support to struggling students. Peer support not only provides students with academic assistance, but also opportunities to improve their social skills, break down stereotypes and to build community with fellow learners. These programs also benefit the student coaches and tutors by providing leadership opportunities that help develop self-esteem, in addition to reinforcing their own knowledge as they support others.

Learners can access support from peer tutors for course-specific content in certain program areas, as well as peer support in areas such as technology, writing and language.

In 2023, the Academic Success Center offered the following:

- Peer Tutors for 60 hours per week in the following program areas: Practical Nurse (30 hours/week), Foundational Learning Math (12 hours/week), High School Math and Science (6 hours/week), Software Development (4 hours/week), Interior Decorating (4 hours/week) and Entertainment Arts (4 hours/week).
- Peer Technology Assistants who attended New Student Orientation and conducted classroom visits, in addition to providing 33 hours per week of support to assist students with signing up for accounts and using BVC-supported platforms including MSOffice, MS Teams and D2L).
- Peer Writing Coaches who committed 10 hours per week of foundational writing support for all students.
- Peer Language Coaches who offered 10 hours weekly of additional support to lowerlevel practical School of Global Access students in speaking, listening and reading.

At the start of February 2023, Peer Learning Support was moved under the Management of the Library and Learning Commons. In May 2023, peer learning support transitioned from 14 weeks per semester to 16 weeks, an extension that provided students with support at the end of term. An individual "matching" program based on the delivery of the model used by the Chiu School of Business was also piloted during this period, as well as transitioning the semester honorarium payment model to an hourly honorarium paid monthly.

In Spring/Summer 2023, the Academic Success Center hosted:

- 699 hours of individual support
- 168 learners who received assistance
- 90 Peer Tutors

#### Financials

Thank you for your generous commitment to Bow Valley College and our students. Your commitment of \$110,000 in 2022/23 towards your groundbreaking \$1.25 million 2017 pledge continues to make an impact each year and ensures countless students have access to the supports they need to succeed and graduate on time.
